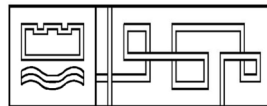

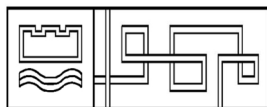

About Bratislava

Bratislava has old-town charm, with it's well maintained historical centre, restaurants, traditional pubs, good music ranging from jazz to opera, etc.

The Danube River itself is one of the city's main assets. There is number of small restaurants and cafes along its banks, within walking distance to the centre. Of particular interest is a 'UFO' shaped restaurant on the top of Danube bridge with an eponymous bar high above the river. The pedestrian decks of the New and Old Bridges are good places to watch the river traffic, including huge Danube barges, glide past. Alternatively, you can take to the water yourself: daily hydrofoil services link the city with nearby Vienna.

The hillsides on the edge of the city have been home to vineyards for centuries, and close to Bratislava are wine towns where you can taste the best.



History of ISE

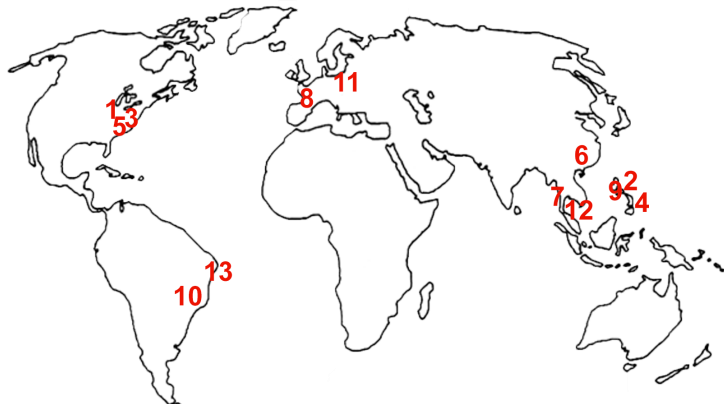


The series of “**International Seminars on Elastomers**” (ISE) started in late 1970’s by Professors M. Morton and N. Yamazaki. It soon became one of the most prestigious forums for pure and applied Rubber Science and Technology. The ISE is organized in various countries and by the ISE14 entered in the fifth decade.

ISE offers an outstanding scene for the interactive transfer of innovative ideas, new material concepts and application oriented solutions between experts from universities, institutes and industry around the world.

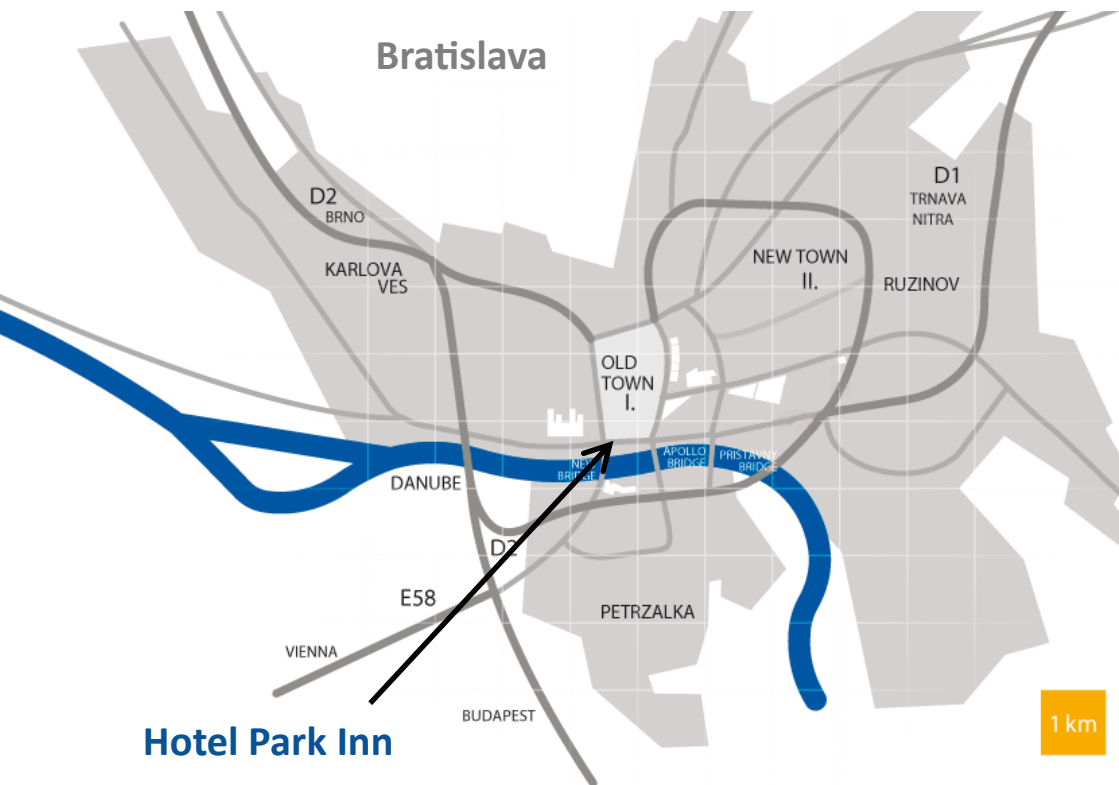


How to reach to Bratislava

AIR CONNECTION to Bratislava is most convenient **via Vienna International Airport** which is accessible from all major airports in Europe. A regular bus connection from Vienna airport is an easy and convenient way to reach Bratislava; number of buses operates between the airport and Bratislava centre between 6:00 AM up to 23:00 PM in one hour periods or more frequently. The bus stop is directly in front of the airport arrival hall and the journey takes 60 minutes. One of the stops in Bratislava is located 100 m from the Park Inn hotel where the conference takes place. The more detailed information including bus schedules will be available on the conference web site from May.

A number of flights from European cities is operating directly to Bratislava International Airport.

A JOURNEY BY CAR OR BY TRAIN is also easy and convenient, Bratislava being only 60 km from Vienna, connected by highways with Vienna, Prague and Budapest.
